! 1 Timothy 4.4-5! For every creature of God is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving. For it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer.

If they cannot follow the commands of God at home, how will they ever follow outside of the home? 1 Timothy 3.5 For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?

When God focuses in on the threads of the very fabric of our lives, he is not trying to micromanage or unravel us. He is seeking to prepare us for something so much more than we could have imagined.

What we see as the everyday routine, God sees as the foundation for something so much more. Matthew 25.23 His Lord said unto him, Well done, good and faithful servant.

[2:18] Thou hast been faithful over a few things. I will make thee ruler over many things. Enter thou into the joy of the Lord. God is interested not just in the big things of your life, but in the seemingly insignificant ones as well.

God has no desire to control you. But he does have a desire to bless you. And the only way he can do that is when you let him in, not just to your heart, but into your life as well.
